1. A singles game format, usually played by three or sometimes by more than four players, wherein the players rotate shooting positions counter-clockwise after each frame. For example, in a three-player game, after the first frame is completed, the player at head yellow moves to foot yellow, the player at head black moves to head yellow and the player at foot yellow (who did not shoot discs in the frame) moves to foot black. When played by more than four players, each frame any excess players over four sit out from play, but with one player rotated in to play (to Head Yellow) and one player rotated out of play (from Head Black), maintaining the same order of rotation throughout the game. In a three-player game, play in any frame only takes place at the end with two players, the third player sitting out the frame at the other end. Syn: CUTTHROAT 2. A tournament format wherein each player or team plays a match against every other player or team in the tournament, or against every other player or team in a divided group of the tournament participants.

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
