Speed Shuffling Across the USA

Let's host a cross-club speed shuffle tournament! The goal of this event is to provide an opportunity for players to interact with and compete against players from other clubs across the country in a more accessible way. Participating in out-of-state tournaments can be expensive, intimidating, and a significant time commitment - this tournament is designed to show participants that we're all a part of a broader shuffleboard community outside of our respective clubs.

We hope to have 3-5 clubs participate in the inaugural event.

How it works:

Each club will independently run their own speed shuffle event(s) during a defined two week period. This includes: promoting the event, sharing the provided registration link with their membership, and hosting proctored times when players can complete their speed shuffle.

Promoting the event

We'll provide graphics and instagram posts which can be reshared but we welcome any efforts or suggestions to get folks excited to compete in this cross-club event!

Eligibility

Any member of the host organization (club or state association) is welcome to participate.

Registration

Players will register online using a link that will be shared with each club. Players can register at any time before their club's final proctored session.

Entries

Each player will be allowed to submit ONE entry during the month-long competition. An entry consists of completing 4 frames of speed shuffle on the same court and consecutively. In each of these frames, the first disc is a practice shot for speed; that disc will be removed from the court after it comes to a stop. Discs 2-8 of each of the 4 frames will be aggregated for the player's total score.

Proctored sessions

Over the two week period, each club will run one or more sessions when a proctor will be on-site to observe and collect scores. Players may practice as much as they would like to before the proctored session(s) but each player may only submit ONE entry during the competition. Proctors will be members of the governing board of the association or club running the event, or appointed by the board. Proctors may participate but must complete their entry when a second proctor is present to record their score.

To submit an official score, the player must notify the proctor that they are ready to play. Once a player has told the proctor that their official entry has started, they must complete the 4 frames as their official score; multiple attempts are not allowed.

Score tracking

Proctors will enter the session's scores onto their club's tab of a tracking spreadsheet. As scores are submitted, they will appear on a cross-club leaderboard that everyone can view. This leaderboard will display the player's name and club but not the actual score - this way players won't have an advantage by waiting to participate at the end of the period but hopefully we'll see some fun competition as folks strive to put their club at the top of the board!

Prizing & Payouts

At the end of the period, we'll reveal the winning score(s)! Prizes will be awarded to the top 10 players. Payment for players and clubs will be distributed via Zelle.

Financial breakdown

\$10 entry

- \$5 - Prize pool
- \$0.59 - Processing fees
- \$4.41 - Distributed proportionally across clubs based on participation.
