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INGENIOUS MR. ROSS:

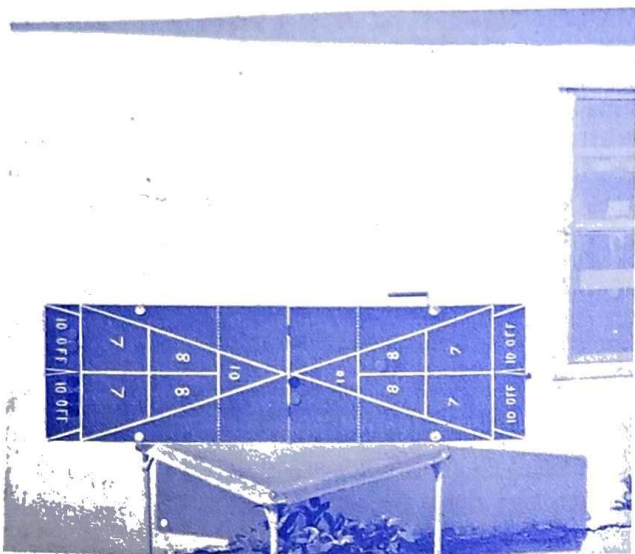
I have designed this miniature shuffleboard to teach referees and beginners in shuffling.

You can teach a group, no matter how large in size, and keep them under control.

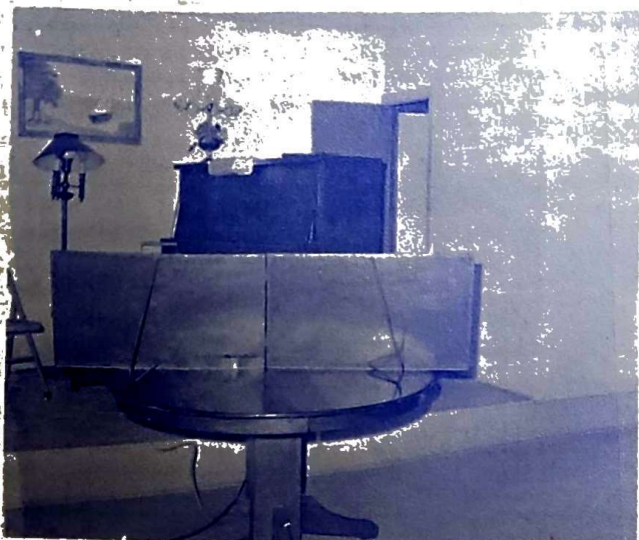
Most any shuffleboard club has a handy man around who could make one.

It is drawn on a scale of 6" to 1" inches. It is made of galvanized metal, cut out 1" larger in length and width than necessary and is bent over $\frac{1}{2}$ " on each side and ends. Now you put a strip of wood around inside of this bent form $\frac{1}{2}$ " x $\frac{3}{4}$ " inches.

The four spots you see on the outside of the board are pieces of cork glued on, to keep the two halves of the board apart, which keeps the paint from sticking in hot weather.
