A plastic that can be poured over old or new courts, with a hard finish that will never come loose on a clean court regardless of the thickness; its the only way you can make a level court.

No more yellow or black; no more lines to paint; no more waxing; no loose beads; easy to clean, play on it when its damp, wet, hot or cold.

I heard a few Pro shufflers say it takes a year to break in a new court; today you can break in any new court in one hours time, Cement or Plastic.

I have an experimental court at the Lake Wales Shuffleboard Club, and if you want to do something that is good for shuffleboard you will check it out yourself; if you like it I can tell you how to make a better one and where to get the material.
