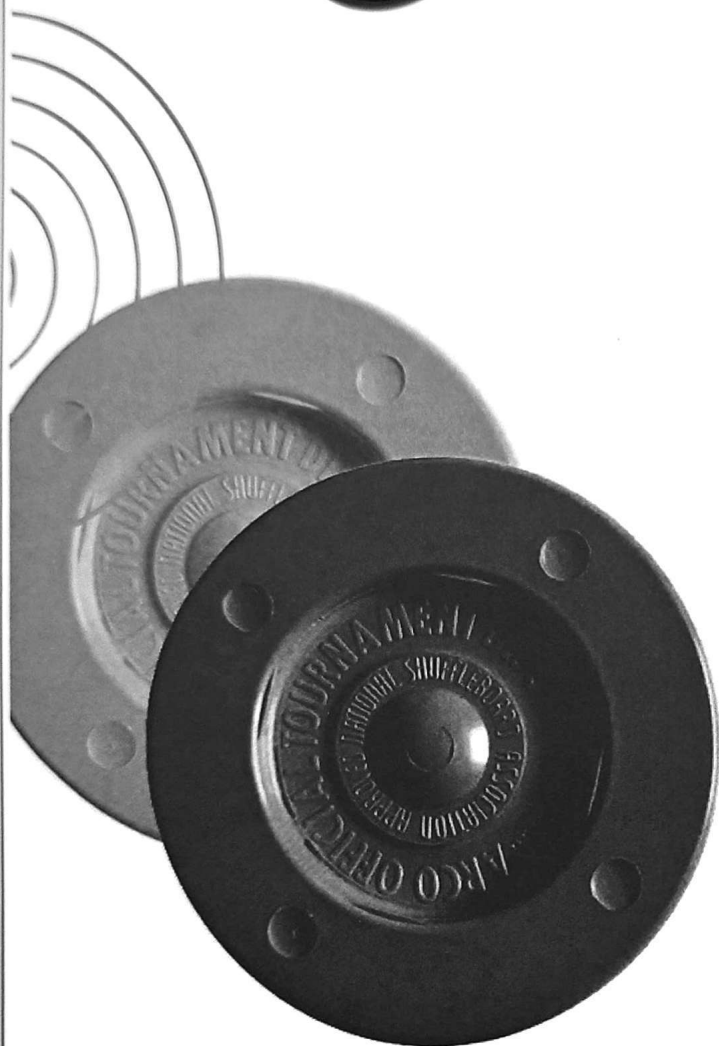


Tournament Discs

6 inches, 15 ounces

Phenolic Resin

Phenolic resins are a type of synthetic thermosetting resin invented by Dr. Leo Baekeland in 1907. The material was originally called Bakelite. This was effectively the first plastic to be sold commercially, and was typified by the old-style black telephones.



The discs shall be made of a composition not less than 9/16" and not more than 1" in thickness, 6" in diameter, and not less than 11-1/2 ounces in weight. New discs shall weigh 15 ounces. Four (4) discs shall be colored yellow, four (4) colored black. These eight (8) discs comprise a set. Other colored combinations may be used, such as white, red, blue, etc., as long as there are two (2) contrasting colors. Care should be taken that all discs in a set shall be uniform in weight and thickness. Source: Florida Shuffleboard Association Rules
